Materials, Technology and Zoom Usage Agreement

All students at Atlas Bible College acknowledge and agree to the following:

Atlas Bible College is conducted using live, virtual, and online environments. For our digital needs, we use ZOOM and Moodle. ZOOM is an internet based, meeting platform. Moodle is an education platform where students access their assignments, tests, and classroom instructions.

ZOOM Agreement:

- To be considered present in class, students must be online with their camera turned and within view of the instructor throughout the ZOOM meeting.
- Students must be in an environment that is free from audio and visual distractions for both the student and for those who can see the student in the virtual classroom.
- Students should not participate in distracting activities: <u>Examples of distracting activities may include, but are not limited to</u> eating meals, holding conversations, interacting with individuals outside of those in the classroom, inappropriate attire, doing other online activities such as Facebook, and other forms of multi-tasking. - Students should behave in the same way on ZOOM as they would in a live classroom.
 For example, one would bring neither a pet nor young children to the classroom.
 Therefore, the student should arrange for childcare or pet sitting for a ZOOM class in the same way they would if they were to attend a physical class. (student initials)

 The digital aspect of this course cannot be accessed and effectively utilized solely using an iPhone or other hand-held device. Students will need to have an up-to-date laptop, iPad/Tablet, or desktop computer. (*student initials* ____) Students must have all the required textbooks for the course. Student Conduct and Expectations Agreement

All students at Atlas Bible College must agree to the following:

Atlas Bible College students, administration, board members, and professors all agree that we will always conduct ourselves in a Christlike and biblically consistent manner in both our personal and public lives.

In the classroom (physical or virtual), students will be respectful of their peers and instructors. Discourteous, disrespectful, or distracting behavior will not be tolerated. Such behavior may result in a student being required to leave the classroom (online meeting), and in some cases, the student may be removed from Atlas Bible College.

Examples of classroom misconduct that will not be tolerated:

- Disorderly Conduct Distracting Activities Persistent Side talking (at professor's discretion)
- Disrespectful interactions with classmates, professors, or administration
- Harassment Verbal Abuse Assault
- Interference with the Instructional Process
- Attending Class Under the Influence of Intoxicating Substances
- Use of Profanity

Student Course Expectations:

- Students are expected to complete their required course assignments.
- Students are expected to come to class prepared to participate in the classroom discussions.
- Students are expected to Attend and Actively Participate in all Classes and Intensives
- Students are expected to Complete all Online Assignments
- ** Failure to meet the student course expectations may result in the student being removed from Atlas Bible College.

Student Ethical Expectations:

- Students will not plagiarize, cheat, lie or steal.
- Students will not engage in Sexually Immoral Behavior: Such behaviors include but are • not limited to fornication, adultery, cohabitation, homosexuality, pornography and similar unbiblical behaviors.
- ** Failure to meet the student ethical expectations will result in the student being removed from Atlas Bible College.

Student Church Participation Expectations:

- All students will be involved in a local church where they are actively serving and are accountable to an elder, staff pastor, or senior pastor.
- Students that are transitioning between churches will be given a grace period not to exceed 2 months to accommodate the transition.
- ** Failure to meet the student church participation expectations will result in the student being removed from Atlas Bible College.

Students that have been removed from Atlas Bible College:

- will not receive credit for the course work that they have completed to date.
- will not be considered for readmission for at least 1 full year.
- will need to agree to a plan of restoration before readmission is considered

Atlas Bible College - Statement of Faith - Adopted in 2017

"In necessariis unitas, in dubiis libertas, in omnibus caritas." - Rupertus Meldenius

- **THE BIBLE** The Bible, both the Old and New Testaments, is God's Word to us. It was written by human authors, under the supernatural guidance of the Holy Spirit. It is the supreme source of truth for Christian beliefs and living. The Bible, in its original autographs, is infallible, inerrant, and true. Psalm 12:6, 119:105, 160; Proverbs 30:5; 2 Timothy 1:13; 3:16; 2 Peter 1:20-21
- **GOD** God is the eternally self-existent, infinite, omnipotent, and omniscient, creator and ruler of the universe. He eternally exists in three persons: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. These three are identical in nature, equal in power, and equal in glory, having the same attributes and perfections. Deuteronomy 6:4; Psalm 90:2; Isaiah 45:5-7; Matthew 28: 19; John4:24; 1 Corinthians 8:4; 2 Corinthians 13:14
 - **God the Father** has revealed Himself as a Spirit without limit or defect. He is concerned with our lives and desires a personal, loving relationship with each of us. He hears and answers prayers, and He saves from sin and death all who come to Him in faith through Jesus Christ. Deuteronomy 32:6; 1 Chronicles 29:11; Psalm 145:8-9; Romans 8:14; 1 Corinthians 8:6; Ephesians 4:6
 - **God the Son** Jesus Christ is the Son of God. He is coequal with the Father. He is fully God and fully man. He was conceived of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He lived a perfect, sinless life and offered himself as the final sacrifice for the sin of mankind. He physically arose from the dead after three days demonstrating His power over sin and death. He ascended to Heaven where He is our High Priest and Advocate. His powerful and glorious return is immanent. Micah 5:2; Matthew 1:23, 25; Luke 1:26-35; John 1:1-14, John 5:23; 10:30; 14:9; Acts 1:9-11; Philippians 2:5-8; Colossians 1:15-17, 2:9; 14:9-10; Hebrews 1:2
 - **God the Spirit** The Holy Spirit is coequal with the Father and the Son of God. He is present in the world to make men aware of their need for Jesus Christ. He indwells every Christian from the moment of salvation. He provides the Christian with power for living, understanding of spiritual truth, and guidance in doing what is right. As Christians we seek to live under His control daily as we are being conformed to the likeness of Jesus Christ. John 14:16-17, 16:7-13; Acts 1:8; 1 Corinthians 2:12, 3:16; 2 Corinthians 3:17; Galatians 5:16-25; Ephesians 4:30–32
- **THE CREATION** Everything in Heaven and on Earth, the universe, and even time itself, was created from nothing by a sovereign act of God. Genesis 1:1-28; Psalm 146:6; john 1:3, 10; Colossians 1:16 Revelation 14:7

- THE FALL OF MAN Man was created in the image of God. Adam, the first man, through a willful act of disobedience to God, brought sin and death into the world. Sin infects every person and separates us from God. Genesis 1:27; Romans 3:23; Romans 5:12
- SALVATION Only by trusting in Jesus Christ can anyone be saved from sin and its consequences. When we turn from our self-ruled life and turn to Jesus in faith we are saved. Eternal life begins the moment one receives Jesus Christ as Lord of his or her life. John 1:12, 3:16,14:6; Romans 3:23; 5:8-10, 6:23, 10:9-10, 13; Galatians 3:26; Ephesians 2:8-9; Titus 3:5
- **ETERNITY** People will either exist eternally separated from God by sin or exist eternally with God through forgiveness and salvation. To be eternally separated from God is eternity in Hell. To be eternally in union with God is eternal life in Heaven. Heaven and Hell are real places of eternal existence. John 3:16, 14:1-3; 17; 2 Corinthians 5:10; Revelation 7:15–17, 20:10, 15.
